Galatians 2:20

"I am (have been) crucified with Christ (our union with Christ's death, which renders us dead to our old condemning relationship to God's Law, as in Galatians 2:19, the time when we lived in defeat and were ruled by the power of sin, as in Rom. 6:6 and Gal. 5:24 = CRUCIFIXION): nevertheless I live (through my union with Christ's resurrection life = REGENERATION); yet not I (I do not live by my own power and strength = LEGALISM), but Christ liveth in me (to grant me power and victory = LIBERTY): and the life which I now live in the flesh (my earthly body and existence) I live by the faith of the Son of God, (RELIANCE = I depend on Christ's resurrection life and power within me, I trust or express faith in Christ's present-day power and spiritual provision for my life, as He lives within my heart — Eph. 6:10) who loved me, and gave himself for me" (MOTIVATION = out of loving appreciation for His sacrifice on my behalf, I will yield myself to His indwelling life and power, and live and serve Jesus Christ).

Galatians 2:20 speaks of possessing a knowledge and awareness of Christ's presence in our daily living: "I am (have been) crucified with Christ (the DEATH FACTOR - through union with Christ's death we have died to the old, self-centered, self-righteous, and sinful person we used to be under the power and mastery of the sin nature): nevertheless I live (the LIFE FACTOR - sharing Christ's risen life through union with Him); yet not I (the old 'I' or person we once were under sin's power, living in defeat, without possessing new life and victory and the power we needed to live victoriously), but Christ liveth in me (to grant us power, victory, and new life, but Christ does not work automatically, we must apply faith): and the life which I now live in the flesh (our body) I live by the faith of the Son of God (faith in His daily person, power, and spiritual provisions), who loved me, and gave himself for me" (the MOTIVATIONAL FACTOR).

Without possessing this knowledge or daily awareness of Jesus Christ in our lives (2 Peter 1:3, 8; 3:18), we will eventually be overtaken by the world, the flesh, and the Devil. We will become barren and unfruitful (2 Pet. 1:8). Here is the story of our lives as Christians:

"Dying with Jesus, by death reckoned mine; Living with Jesus a new life divine; Looking to Jesus till glory doth shine, Moment by moment, O Lord, I am Thine."
