

How Can a Jewish Person Find Peace With God?

Dear Jewish friend,

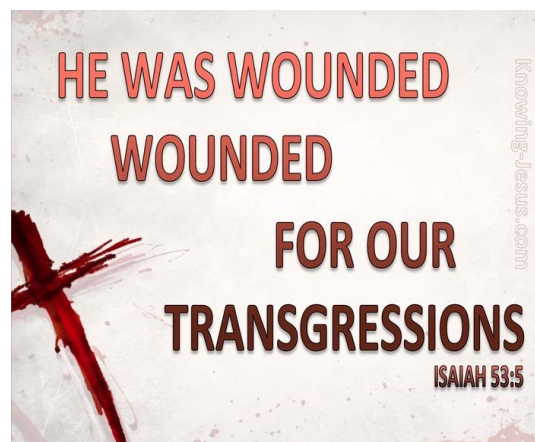
I believe it can be proven that the prophecy of Isaiah 53 is talking about Jesus. He was the true Messiah. The Messiah (Jesus Christ) is the One Who gives you the hope of everlasting life in Heaven. Because of the Messiah a Jewish person can find peace with God. This peace comes through the forgiveness of sins and receiving the free gift of eternal life in Heaven, which Messiah offers to you today.



There is something that the God of Israel requires of every Jewish person. You must KNOW what Messiah has done for you personally and RECEIVE His free gift of forgiveness and eternal life.

- 1. Messiah came to earth to die for your sins. This means He took the judgment for all of your sins and now wants to rescue you from hell.**

Isaiah 53:5-6, an Old Testament prophecy, says: “But he was **wounded for our transgressions, he was bruised for our iniquities** (the Messiah died in your place – taking the judgment you deserved for sinning against God): the chastisement of our **peace** (peace before God – having a right relationship with God) was upon him; and **with his**



stripes we are healed (you are healed spiritually by receiving forgiveness for all of your sins). All we like sheep have **gone astray**; we have turned every one to his **own way** (you have sinned against God); and the Lord hath **laid on him** (the Messiah) the iniquity (the sin) of us all.”

Isaiah 53:12 adds these words:

“...and he was numbered with the transgressors; and he bare the sin of many, and made intercession for the transgressors.”

Messiah died in your place, taking the wrath of God for your sins, so you could be forgiven and go free!

Psalm 22:14 – Old Testament Prophecy of Messiah on the Cross:

“I am poured out like water, and all my bones are out of joint: my heart is like wax; it is melted in the midst of my bowels.”

Psalm 22:16 – Another Prophecy of Messiah on the Cross:

“For dogs have compassed me: the assembly of the wicked have inclosed me: they pierced my hands and my feet.”

Psalm 22:17 – Another Prophecy of Messiah on the Cross:

“I may tell all my bones: they look and stare upon me.”

Jesus was the Messiah who died in your place, as your substitute, taking the penalty for sin that you deserved. He died for you, as you, and in your place to grant you the freedom and peace that comes from knowing all of your sins are forgiven and that you are saved from sin’s judgment (hell).

2. Messiah rose from the dead to give you eternal life with Him forever. The prophecies declare this to be true.



Isaiah 53:10 – “Yet it pleased the Lord to bruise him (the Messiah); he hath put him to grief: when thou shalt make his soul **an offering for sin** (Messiah’s death on the cross), **he shall see his seed, he shall prolong his days** (Messiah’s resurrection), and the pleasure of the Lord shall prosper in his hand.”

Psalm 16:10 – **Old Testament Prophecy about Messiah’s resurrection:** “For thou wilt not leave my soul in hell; neither wilt thou **suffer thine Holy One to see corruption** (the promise of Messiah’s resurrection).”

The Messiah did not remain in the grave. He rose again the third day conquering death, the devil, hell, and the grave, so that He might give you the hope and promise of eternal life with God in Heaven.

3. Messiah is now at God’s right hand.

Psalm 110:1, a prophecy from the Old Testament, reveals: “The Lord (God the Father) said unto my Lord (the Messiah – God the Son), Sit thou at my right hand, until I make thine enemies thy footstool.”



Jesus is at the right hand of the Father today. We should believe in the God of Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob, who is eternal (Psalm 90:2). But the

Bible also reveals that the Messiah (God's Son) is eternal for He shares the Father's nature and existence as the one, true, eternal God – "Hear, O Israel: The LORD our God *is* one LORD" (DEUTERONOMY 6:4).

Micah 5:2, a minor prophet of the Jewish Scriptures, reveals this:

"But thou, Bethlehem Ephratah, though thou be little among the thousands of Judah, yet out of thee shall he (the Jewish Messiah) come forth unto me that is to be ruler in Israel; whose goings forth have been from of old, from everlasting."

4. Messiah can forgive all your sins.



Micah 7:19, the Old Testament prophet, joyfully writes: "He will turn again, he will have compassion upon us (the Jewish people); he will subdue our iniquities (God's chosen and beloved people); **and thou wilt cast all their sins into the depths of the sea.**"

Zechariah 13:1, another Old Testament prophet, reveals this:

"In that day there shall be a fountain opened to the house of David and to the inhabitants of Jerusalem for sin and for uncleanness."



Zechariah 12:10 adds these solemn words: “And I will pour upon the house of David (the Jewish people), and upon the inhabitants of Jerusalem, the spirit of grace and of supplications: and **they (the**

Jewish people) shall look (in faith) upon me whom they have pierced (crucified on the cross), and they shall mourn for him, as one mourneth for his only son, and shall be in bitterness for him, as one that is in bitterness for his firstborn.”

Jesus, as the Messiah, was pierced for you upon the cross. Only the Messiah can grant you cleansing and forgiveness of sins. If you will look to Him today, by expressing your faith in Him (the Messiah), you can have peace before God (Isaiah 53:5) and also find the peace of God that comes from having all your sins forgiven.

5. Messiah MUST be received or embraced as your personal Savior so you can receive forgiveness of sins and be delivered from God’s wrath (hell).

Joel 2:32, writing as an Old Testament prophet, reveals:

“And it shall come to pass, **that whosoever** (any Jewish person) **shall call on the name of the Lord** (the Messiah) **shall be delivered (delivered from sin’s judgment which is hell and given eternal life):** for in mount Zion and in Jerusalem shall be deliverance, as the Lord hath said, and in the remnant whom the Lord shall call.”

Every Jew must **call on the name of the Lord** (express faith in Jesus the Messiah) in order to receive the forgiveness of sins, be delivered from God’s wrath (hell), and go to Heaven when he dies.

Will you express faith in Jesus the Messiah or place all of your confidence and trust in the Messiah to grant you forgiveness of sins and deliver you from hell?

You can say the words of Isaiah 53 in your own heart while reading them and place your faith in the Messiah (the Lord Jesus Christ).

Are you ready? Transfer your faith to the Messiah (the Lord Jesus Christ) right now. As you read Isaiah's prophecy about Messiah's salvation, you can make these words your own personal prayer, and receive Messiah's salvation.



A Jewish Prayer for Peace

“But he (Messiah) was wounded for our transgressions, he was bruised for our iniquities: the chastisement of our peace was upon him; and with his stripes we are healed. Dear God, I BELIEVE what the prophecy says. You can give me spiritual healing and forgiveness for all my sins through the Messiah. You have made Messiah's soul **an offering for my sin**, when Jesus died on the cross, but **he (Messiah) shall see his seed, he shall prolong his days.** I BELIEVE what the prophecy says. Jesus also rose from the dead to give me the free gift of eternal life in Heaven. Thank you Messiah, thank You Lord Jesus Christ, for the forgiveness of all my sins, for saving me from hell, and giving me the free gift of eternal life. In Jesus' name, Amen.”

If you have placed your faith in the Messiah, who is Jesus Christ, you have now found peace, the peace that comes from knowing that all of
