## John 3:16 According to Hyper Calvinism

"For God (a sovereign God who in eternity past determines the destiny of people by arbitrarily choosing one person to go to Heaven and another person to be dammed to hell) so loved the world (the world of the elect – the people God chose to save over others, while bypassing the other people that He has chosen to hate and damn to hell), that he gave his only begotten Son (to die on the cross only for the elect He chose to save but not the non-elect, since dying for nonelect sinners that could never be saved would make His death meaningless and worthless), that whosoever (of only the elect group He chooses to save while bypassing the rest and consigning them to everlasting hell) believeth in him (whose faith is made possible through a prior regeneration, the time God gives faith to His elect, so as an already saved or born again person they can express faith in Christ, the faith God gave to that person at the time of regeneration, so God gets credit for a person's faith, since man is dead, cannot do anything, cannot believe, and since human faith is a form of legalistic works) should not perish (go to hell for rejecting Christ, since God determined to save the elect and believe for them, giving them elective faith, while at the same time condemning the non-elect for not believing, even though they could not believe), but have everlasting life" (which can only be knowingly possessed by perseverance in good works, to prove if a person's faith in Christ, which saves them, is really genuine, or if God actually did give them the initial elective faith to believe, with the end result that a person can now possess an assurance – but not absolute assurance - of his salvation by viewing his good works, in order to determine if his salvation is genuine and he is actually one of the elect that God chose to save).
